



Charles County Snow Removal Schedule



To better serve and inform you, the Charles County Public Works Roads Division has developed the following Snow Response Target Time for County roads.

Primary Roads and Major Residential Roads	3 to 4 inches 5 to 7 inches 8 to 10 inches 11 to 15 inches 24 inches	Passable within 12 hours Passable within 18 to 24 hours Passable within 24 to 36 hours Passable within 36 to 48 hours Passable within 48 to 60 hours
Minor Residential Roads and Cul-de-sacs	3 to 4 inches 5 to 7 inches 8 to 10 inches 11 to 15 inches 24 inches	1 pass made within 12 hours 1 pass made within 18 hours 1 pass made within 24 hours 1 pass made within 36 hours 1 pass made within 48 hours

- All roads will be plowed to bare pavement as soon as possible after a storm has ended
- A storm has "ended" when wind has diminished and temperatures start to rise above freezing
- Passable is not considered bare pavement
- Plowing generally begins with an accumulation of snow between 1" and 3" deep
- Please note, the type of snow (wet or powdery), the temperatures, and wind conditions following a storm can alter this schedule
